

Grace Lockrobin is Co-Director of SAPERE - a UK charity that works to realise the benefits of a philosophical education as widely and equitably as possible. A Philosopher of Education by training, her responsibilities at SAPERE concern all things philosophical and educational and her role is to ensure that SAPERE's strategy, programmes and people achieve their aims.

Before she joined SAPERE, she worked as a philosopher in academic and community spaces. She founded the not-for-profit Thinking Space in 2008 and subsequently spent hundreds of hours philosophising with communities. Between 2010 and 2022, she was a Teaching Fellow in philosophy at the University of Leeds where she taught philosophers to practise philosophical enquiry in local schools and used practices of philosophical enquiry to teach students on programmes as varied as medicine, business, and engineering.

Grace is also a Fellow of Advance HE (Since 2019); a Board Member of Sophia, the European Foundation for the Advancement of Doing Philosophy with Children (since 2019); an Editorial Board Member of the Journal of Philosophy in Schools (since 2020); a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts (since 2022); and a Council Member of the Royal Institute of Philosophy (since 2023). Grace is completing a PhD at the Institute of Education, University College London, where she writes on ethics, education, and aesthetics under the supervision of Prof Paul Standish and thanks to a grant from ESRC.
